Reports for 2009/2010

Electoral Roll

Following publication of Statutory Notices the annual revision of the electoral role took place on Tuesday 30th March 2010. Last year we began with 52 names on the Electoral Roll since then 3 names have been removed and 3 added leaving a current total of 52. Notification has been sent to the Secretaries of both the Diocesan Synod and Deanery Synod.

Treasurer's Report for the year ending 31st December 2009

Financially 2009 has been a good year for the Hazelwood PCC accounts.

There has been a total income of - £30,852

and a total expense of - £28,095

giving an excess of - + £2757 (plus investment income of £1,193)

A total of - + £3,950 (excluding the West End Project expense and donations received
the net gain would have been £3,047)

It has been necessary to transfer £4,500 from the deposit account but it has been possible to return £8,000 to the deposit account. This includes a restricted donation of £1,000.

The assets held in the current account and deposit account has therefore increased from - £13,718
Dec 2008 to £17,704 Dec 2009

The current account stands at £1,207 on 31st Dec 2009. (liabilities for the month of Jan 2010 amount to £1,806 including £285 for unpaid cheques issued before 31st Dec 09.)

The liabilities for the year 2010 amount to £19,105 being the parish quota of - £17,021 (£1,419 per month) and Ecclesiastical Insurance - £1,800 approx. and unpaid cheques £285.

Income from Gift Aid Tax recovered, Gift Aid donations, magazines, floodlighting and fund raising events have all been maintained to a high level. Income tax recovered from Gift Aid amounted to £3607 (From Regular Giving Jan – Dec 08 was £1292, West End donations was £1,119 and from the envelopes 2009 was £1,196). Further amounts are due to be claimed amounting to £1,421. (£241 Envelopes, £1,116 Regular Giving and £64 from West End Project donations.)

The PCC has benefited this year from a total sum of £3,449 in fees for weddings funerals and baptisms and £3,132 in donations related to these services. Allowing for PCC expenses of £1,278 this amounts to a 'one off' net gain of £5,303. Most of the donations received this year were from funerals.

The total amount that was donated or passed to charities during the year amounted to £1,818.

The major expense this year has been The Parish Share (£17,182) and the upkeep of the church (£4,569) which includes the Insurance (£1,765) and Electricity/Water (£1,496). The excellent result is thanks again to all the efforts of everyone who contribute in all that they do for the Church.

Deanery Synod

There were no meetings during the year. However three are now planned for the coming year.

MMA Representative Report

The Belper MMA [Mission and Ministry Area] Council met a few times in the past year, and both Tessa Hibbert and the Vicar attended, representing St John 's.

This year, the work of the MMA has been somewhat inhibited. There was an interregnum at both Belper Christ Church [and its sister churches of Turnditch and Ambergate] and Belper St Peter's [and it's sister Churches of Belper St Swithun's, Belper St Mark's and Heage St Luke's. The number of working stipendiary priests was down from three to one. The Bishop has yet to appoint an MMA Vicar after the retirement of Canon Parsons of St Peter's.

Ishbel Rapkin of Turnditch Parish Church chaired meetings, and together, the Council

- organised both the annual May Bank Holiday Walk and a meal in October at the Nailers;
- participated in the Carol Service at Christ Church on the Sunday after Christmas
- supported the lecture given by Bishop Alistair at Hazelwood on 1st July 2009, entitled "My vision for the Diocese of Derby".

The MMA Banner Making Group displayed several items at Bishop Alistair's lecture. The Licensed Readers met quarterly with clergy [full time and retired] to ensure ministry for the Sunday services in all the parishes.

Chiefly, The MMA Council is presently wrestling with a review of the workload shared by the Stipendiary Priests in the MMA. Until recently, the Priest at Belper St Peter's ministered Heage St Luke's. With the Bishop's permission, this will not continue. However, St Luke's needs identifiable leadership - preferably from within the MMA - but no one yet knows who will take on this task. Maybe the responsibilities of each of the stipendiaries will have to be reconfigured. To help the discussion, the Archdeacon of Derby, the Ven. Christopher Cunliffe, attended the last MMA meeting and will attend the next meeting also.

Late last year, St Peter's PCC wished to "explore the implication of belonging to the MMA". There were rumours of their pulling out. The discussion continues.

Two full time stipendiary priests have been appointed to serve at Christ Church and St Peter's. The Revd Jonathan Page [who is also to be Rural Dean of Duffield Chapter] was licensed at Christ Church on Friday 5th February 2010; Revd Anne Stratton JP will be licensed to St Peter's on Thursday 22nd April.

- 8) Planning for Special services and events including the Church fete

Report from the Vicar, Revd Robert Harris

Vicar's Report

APCM, Hazelwood, 2010.

You will need to hear my intentions for the next few months, and the consequent responsibilities of the Churchwardens and PCC.

My final service in the Benefice will be on 31 October. On 1st November, I shall be retired. I suggest, and I will similarly suggest to the Church Councils at both Holbrook and Milford, that there be only one service on 31 October - at Hazelwood at 11.00am. This will be an opportunity for each of the congregations to gather in one place, and for all of us to say good-bye together.

Before that date, I suggest that our services and events proceed as normal, but with one exception. I can foresee that during the interregnum there could be trouble in engaging a priest to celebrate on the third Sunday of each month at 9.45am. It is difficult because many priests like to make as much use of a Sunday morning as possible: it is too early with an 8.00am before, and too late to fit in with an 11.00am after. I will suggest at the next PCC meeting that we retime the service to 11.00am, commencing in July 2010.

From July 2010 [with the exception of August and with the PCC's permission], we could have a series of special services at 11.00am on the third Sunday of each month. On 18th July, a service with an invitation to those Baptised at Hazelwood in the last 10years. On 19 September inviting those married at Hazelwood in the past 10years. On 17 October inviting those bereaved in the past year.

In August, we could have our usual series of outdoor services. For family reasons, I would prefer Harvest Festival to be celebrated at 3.00pm on 3 October and not on 26 September.

I will make for the PCC and Churchwardens a diary of services for the next year. To cover the first three months of the interregnum, I will endeavour to appoint someone [a priest or licensed reader] to conduct worship each Sunday - and at Christmas. I will approach the Bishops and the Archdeacon asking if they are also willing and able to help.

Thereafter, I suggest that the PCC asks the Churchwardens [or someone else] to take on the task of finding a priest/licensed reader. I recommend that, when someone comes to church to help, they be invited to return before they go home!

Regarding my retirement, I will follow the recommendation offered from the experience of the past: that for the first six months of my retirement I will not conduct any Sunday services. It will be an invaluable time of adjustment - both for Janet and for me. If I am able and available, I may be approached to conduct a funeral - but I sincerely hope this will not arise.

During November 2010, Janet and I will be clearing the Vicarage of all our trantlements, to clear it by 30 November.

Regarding the future of this parish, I believe the following to be true: that the Bishop [who is also the Patron] will appoint a new incumbent who will live in Hazelwood Vicarage; the new incumbent will be priest of Hazelwood [with Shottle], Holbrook, and Milford. I guess that the next priest may be given additional responsibilities - but I am only guessing.

Regarding the Churchwardens and PCC, they will have additional responsibilities before and after 31st October, guided and steered by the Rural Dean and the Diocese's senior staff [to whom the Churchwardens may always turn for advice]. Later this year, the Bishop will ask the PCC to hold one or more special meetings [jointly with representatives from Holbrook and Milford, but excluding "the outgoing incumbent, his spouse, and the patron"] chiefly to:

1. Prepare a statement describing the conditions, needs and traditions of the benefice;
2. Appoint representatives who will act on behalf of the PCC in the interview and selection process.

I am sure that someone will think the Benefice is an important and acceptable opportunity. I am certain, also, that this Parish will welcome and support the new incumbent as well as it did for me.

Saying goodbye will not be easy. Adapting in times of change is easier for some than for others. Together and individually, we have a period of upheaval to go through. Janet and I will have our own support networks to turn to. You, the congregation, PCC and Churchwardens will need to turn to each other for your support. This is not a time for withdrawal. Instead, it is a time for supporting one another, helping one another, and encouraging one another. Each of you, please offer to help when and where you can. And I promise you this, that it will be worth it.

I firmly believe that that this is the right time for me to move on - and I believe this is also the right time for this Parish and Benefice to move on. It is the right time for the Parish/Benefice to seek new leadership and new direction. And here is another promise: it will be worth it. The Church here in Hazelwood will be stronger and better, and able to build on the strengths and achievements of the past.

This is my eleventh and final report; and I have said the following at each APCM and it is worth repeating:

"I want to express my thanks to everyone who helps with the running and maintenance of this parish and its two churches. I am very grateful, because each person generously contributes to our worship and mission."

Children and Young People Protection Officers

Safeguarding Training – 25 February 2010

Officers attended the above training which highlighted identification of issues, situations which might arise via information from others and the process and cascade of information for dealing with these. This was extremely useful, well presented and interesting.

Initial Training – 29 April 2010

This will be attended by both officers.

New legal duty to refer information to the Independent Safeguarding Authorise (ISA)

From Oct 2009, organisations, including PCCs will have a new statutory duty to refer information to ISA where there is a change of officer or where the officer has acted inappropriately. Failure to comply with this is a criminal offence. This has superseded previous police checks for officers and those in contact with CYPs. Further information will be provided on this when training is organised.

Health and Safety

With regard to the Health and Safety of CYPs (which forms part of the duties of officers) a survey was undertaken by the current officers and an action plan for issues identified presented to the PCC in Aug 09. Items on this list have now all been actioned by the PCC. Those with an ongoing nature have a review date. A current concern is the slippery state when wet of the main path to the church (item 3a of the aforementioned report) and a proposal for an ongoing solution will be raised with the PCC at the next opportunity (ie: the use on a regular basis of a 'Dairy Cleaner' – hypochlorite which kills moss and algae. Health and safety re storage is being investigated).

Members of the congregation (and also the wider community if issues are brought to the attention of any congregation member) are urged to report any suspicions to a designated officer or to the vicar. Contact details are displayed in the vestry.
