### Reports for 2008/2009

#### Electoral Roll

Following publication of Statutory Notices the annual revision of the electoral role took place on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2009. At the beginning of the period under review there were 47 names on role. Since then 4 names have been removed and 9 names added to the role. This leaves a current total of 52 on the electoral role. Due notification will be sent to the secretaries of both the diocesan synod and deanery synod.

#### Treasurer's Report for the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> December 2008

Financially 2008 has been a demanding year for the Hazelwood PCC accounts.

There has been a total income of - £30,278

and a total expense of - £52,131

giving a shortage of - £21,853

Plus investment income of £1,193

Results in a total of £20,660 (excluding the West End Project expense and donations received the net gain would have been £927)

It has been necessary to transfer £23,200 from the deposit account but it has been possible to return £2,000 to the deposit account.

The assets held in the current account and deposit account has therefore decreased from £34,379 Dec 2007 to £13,718 Dec 2008.

Investment Assets show a reduction from £33,281 to £24,780.

The current account stands at £2,037 on 31st Dec 2008. ( liabilities for the month of Jan 2009 amount to £2,015 including £372 for unpaid cheques issued before 31st Dec 08.)

The liabilities for the year 2009 amount to £19,354 being the parish quota of - £17,182 (£1,432 per month) and Ecclesiastical Insurance - £1,800 approx. and unpaid cheques £372.

Income from Gift Aid Tax recovered, Gift Aid donations, magazines, floodlighting and fund raising events have all been maintained to a high level.

Income tax recovered from Gift Aid amounted to £1,966. (From Regular Giving Apr – Dec 2007 was £1,274 and from the envelopes was £692).

Further amounts are due to be claimed amounting to £2,558. (£321 Envelopes, £1,180 Regular Giving and £1,058 from West End Project donations.)

The PCC has benefited this year from a total sum of £2266 in fees for weddings funerals and baptisms and £1439 in donations related to these services. Allowing for PCC expenses of £1412 this amounts to a 'one off' net gain of £2293. Most of the donations received this year were from weddings.

The total amount that was donated or passed to charities during the year amounted to £1,564.

The major expense this year has been the West End Project £26,554 that includes architects fees of £2,511 and the chairs £1,751. The Parish Share (£15,994) and the upkeep of the church (£3506) which includes the Insurance (£1,748) and Electricity.

West End donations and allocated funds amount to £9,442 (£609 sponsored chairs and £1,058 to be recovered from Gift Aid.)

The excellent result is thanks again to all the efforts of everyone who contribute in all that they do for the Church.

Their offices are based in London and works with governments encouraging marriage, parenting, stable family life, the treatment of children and gender equality with the UNO. The overriding theme remains "Fellowship and fun". Following the excellent and thought provoking address the meeting ended with prays.

### **Report from the Vicar, Revd Robert Harris**

This is my tenth report; and I have said the following at each APCM and it is worth repeating:

"I want to express my thanks to everyone who helps with the running and maintenance of this parish and its two churches. I am very grateful, because each person generously contributes to our worship and mission."

I should like to especially thank the following:

- The Churchwardens, and the Assistant Wardens
- members of the PCC and our Church Officers;
- and the Friends of Shottle Church (FOSC),

Last year two major projects were completed and celebrated.

The first was at Shottle. Much of the restoration of the church is now complete. Last year's final touches were the enlargement of the vestry [it is now also a kitchen and servery], complete decoration, the installation of additional lighting, and the laying of a new carpet [purchased with money bequeathed to the church by Vivian Lane]. The W.I. Flower Festival was excellent; and everyone made every effort for the Harvest Festival service, at which the Bishop of Derby preached and dedicated the work. We were delighted that their Graces, the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire were able to attend. I am very grateful to FOSC [The Friends of Shottle Church] for all their work, and in particular to Mr Peter Hill, who we call the "clerk of works". The building is now fit for purpose. Indeed, a marriage licence has been applied for and we hope that Shottle's first wedding, that of Ken Wigley and Sarah Green, will take place in May 2009.

The other major project was here at Hazelwood. The reordering of the welcome area in the West End is now complete and its first official use was in May when Zoe Hibbert married Steve Bywater. The work did not go as smoothly as we hoped and it has required diligence and patience to get everything right. However, I am confident that most of the teething troubles are behind us, and the project is proving itself extremely useful and worthwhile. Last year I foresaw the welcome area being useful "not just on Sundays after Divine Worship, but also at every baptism, funeral, and wedding, and for a variety of social occasions and meetings." This has proved true. I also foresaw Hazelwood being used more often as an MMA meeting place - having the advantage denied most of our sister churches - adequate and easy car parking. We had an example of this when Professor Thomas came to talk to us and our sister churches about Islam. We had an excellent and informative evening. I am very grateful to our architects [Bakewell & Partners], the Contractors [Milward's] the steering committee [and especially Brian Cantrill], and all who contributed their time, effort and money.

The death of John Watson saddened the beginning of this year. John was not only a faithful member of this church; he was also an excellent Licensed Reader. He led services with dignity. He prepared and delivered thoughtful sermons. He also, as Rev'd Peter Lyne remarked in the obituary printed in this month's church magazine, gave this parish "valuable spiritual leadership" during the "difficult and uncertain period following the retirement of Rev'd Norman Daughtry". Both Rev'd Lyne and I found John enormously helpful when we first came to serve at Hazelwood. He offered us friendship, advice, and help. Indeed, when I was new to the parish, I immediately felt able to trust him as I settled in. I am so glad that his widow, Mary, wishes to continue offering hospitality at the monthly communion service held at their house.

I offer the advice given to a village church some time ago, which was, *Do what you do well, but do it better.* Indeed, constantly look for ways of doing things better. There is no need to go looking for new tasks; instead concentrate on what is being done, and do it better than ever.

## **Child Protection**

John Morley was appointed Child Protection Coordinator by the PCC on the 16<sup>th</sup> October 2008 to replace David Bentley who had relinquished the position. Thanks are due to David for the work he has done in the past. The appointment of JM has been confirmed in writing by Alistair Langton who is the Youth Advisor for the Diocese of Derby. The necessary CRB Enhanced Disclosures having been received.

The PCC has adopted the House of Bishops Policy on Child Protection (2004). New mandatory Procedures and Good Practice Guidelines were introduced by the Diocese in June 2008. The Child Protection Coordinator has implemented these in the Parish on behalf of the PCC.

The Validation Process for the Sunday School teachers is now almost complete. At the time of writing receipt of satisfactory references is still required for 3 of the Sunday School teachers.

Initial Risk Assessments have been completed for the St. John's Church Hazelwood, the 1914 / 1919 Hazelwood Memorial Hall and St Lawrence Church Shottle. Identified risks will be presented to the PCC for consideration.

The Child Protection Coordinator continues to request the appropriate training ie the Basic Child Protection Awareness course and the Child Protection Coordinators Course.
